



Safety Moment ~ Stroke*



Safety Moment Ideas & Tips*







Stroke is one of the most common causes of severe and long-term disability in America, and while most strokes occur in people over 65, they can occur at any age. In many cases permanent disability can be prevented or reduced—but only if the stroke victim receives immediate medical attention. To avoid delay, learn the signs of stroke and remember to act quickly, noting the time the stroke began and calling 911. Remember that minutes count!



What is a Stroke...

- Most of the time, a stroke, or brain attack, is caused by a blood clot that blocks a blood vessel in the brain.
- The part of the brain that becomes ischemic, or deprived of oxygen by the clot, is temporarily stunned, and the parts of the body it controls stop working properly
- The more quickly blood flow is restored, the better the chance of recovery
- Sometimes stroke symptoms are mild and go away on their own
 - These transient ischemic attacks, also known as TIAs or ministrokes, can be a warning of larger strokes to come and should be evaluated and treated by a physician



Stroke Symptoms...

The classic signs of a stroke are easy to recognize. Remember "FAST"...

- F— Face drooping. This usually involves one side of the face. Is the person's smile uneven or is their face numb? Is their mouth uneven when you ask them to smile? Do both sides of the face move as they normally would?
- A— Arm weakness on one side. Sudden weakness, clumsiness or inability to move an arm, leg, or hand are signs of a stroke. Does one arm drift downward when you ask the person to raise both of their arms?
- S— Slurred speech or a sudden difficulty speaking
- T— Time is critical! Call 911, even if the symptoms go away



What Should You Do...

- Call 911 immediately when these symptoms occur and tell the dispatcher that you suspect a stroke
 - Do not wait to see if the person gets better or worry that you may be overreacting
 - Make a note of the time the symptoms began and pass this information on to all health care providers—knowing exactly when the stroke started is essential for their decisions
 - It is vitally important to call emergency services even if the symptoms seem to go away
- **Do not give aspirin to a stroke victim**
 - Aspirin thins the blood and might complicate the victim's condition: Occasionally a stroke is caused by a ruptured blood vessel rather than a blood clot, and thinning the blood with aspirin can cause more bleeding
 - Without specialized X-rays, no one can tell the difference between a clot and a bleeding blood vessel.
 - After a rupture has been ruled out, a person may be started on aspirin or another blood-thinning drug by their doctor to treat or prevent another stroke


National Exploring Subject Matter Experts & Exploring Resource Associate Advisors



Barriers to Abuse Update

- As part of our ongoing commitment to abuse prevention, the Boy Scouts of America, to include Exploring, is updating the adult supervision requirements for overnight activities
- This update enhances the minimum "two deep leadership" requirements by additionally requiring every adult present on overnight activities to be a registered member of the Boy Scouts of America or Exploring
- These adults must submit an adult application and registration fee, undergo a criminal background check, a volunteer screening database check and must complete mandatory Youth Protection training.
- A limited exception for parents and legal guardians of Cub Scout youth attending overnight with their children is planned due to the family centric nature of Cub Scouting
- All Cub Scout Packs, Scouts BSA Troops, Venturing Crews, Sea Scouting Ships, Exploring Posts, council, and district overnight programs will be required to comply with this update by September 1, 2023. We encourage early adoption prior to the effective date
- This updated Barrier to Abuse will be referenced as part of the Guide to Safe Scouting, Exploring's Safety First Guidelines, Youth Protection and Adult Leadership section, Scouting's Barriers to Abuse. Youth Protection and Barriers to Abuse FAQ's will be expanded to include additional FAQ's as they are developed

A Little History....

Up until 1998, Exploring volunteers could be recognized by the following awards:

- SPURGEON AWARD (upon nomination, could be awarded to Council, Area, Region, and National Exploring volunteers (registered and non-registered) and organizations
- DISTINGUISHED SERVICE TEAM AWARD for Service Team members
- LEADERSHIP AWARD (upon nomination, can be awarded to District/Council level volunteers)
- **EXPLORING KEY** for Service Team Members (who met performance, training, and tenure requirements)
- **EXPLORING KEY** for Advisors (who met performance, training, and tenure requirements)
- EXPLORING TRAINING AWARD (for all other registered Exploring volunteers who met performance, training, and tenure requirements



And in the present...

Currently, Exploring volunteers can be recognized by the following awards:

- SPURGEON AWARD (upon nomination, could be awarded to Council and National Exploring volunteers (registered and non-registered) and organizations
- LEADERSHIP AWARD (upon nomination, can be awarded to District/Council level volunteers)



The near future...

We propose that Exploring volunteers be able to again earn the following awards:

- EXPLORING KEY for Service Team Members (who met performance, training, and tenure requirements)
- EXPLORING KEY for Post Advisors/Club Sponsors (who met performance, training, and tenure requirements)
- EXPLORING TRAINING AWARD (for all other registered Exploring volunteers who met performance, training, and tenure requirements)



The Way Ahead...

We are proposing the National LFL Executive Board re-activate/re-establish the EXPLORING KEY & TRAINING AWARD

- The SPURGEON AWARD "transferred" over to LFL in 1998. A reasonable assumption is that the KEY and TRAINING AWARD did also, although not presently in use
- These two Legacy awards could be re-activated by LFL Board action as an incentive to volunteers, and as an aid in tracking performance and training of our Exploring units
- They could be re-activated with current, proposed requirements that are aligned with comparable Scouting awards at the Venturing/Sea Scout program level (or with updates to the 1994 requirements, the last update before transfer to LFL)
- Since Exploring adults do not wear BSA uniforms, the need for insignia is eliminated. A well-designed, downloadable certificate suitable for framing would suffice and could also be a conversation starter when displayed in a volunteer's place of business, leading to a discussion on Exploring

George Denise completed his Exploring Fast Start training on 1/01/2011 and his most recent position is Service Team Chair for my district since February 2018. He has been involved with every aspect from FOS and volunteer recruitment to membership, product sales, program and unit service. George helped Exploring District achieved significant growth in our FOS campaign and 5% membership growth last year. We are at 61% of our FOS goal for the year, second highest percentage in our council. As we shelter-in-place, he secured a dynamic guest speaker for our Science Night and saved us \$650 in shipping cost in our Make A Mask Challenge. His efforts made it possible for us to donate thousands of pieces of protective medical gear to 7 medical facilities in 2 counties. He supported a 15 year old Scout in the Medical Explorer program whom has wanted to make a difference. What started as a local mask-making challenge turned into a multi-city effort through connections of Scouting friends in Dallas, TX and Orange County, CA to Santa Clara county.

EXPLORING PARTICIPANT POLICY "EP" (18 THROUGH 20 YR OLD EXPLORERS)

Effective August 1, 2020, all applicants 18 through 20 years old must complete and submit an adult application, consent to a criminal background check, and successfully complete Youth Protection training.

However, an 18- through 20-year-old will still be considered an Adult Exploring Participant in the post and will not be considered an adult leader. Therefore, an "EP" will not be allowed to fulfill adult leadership roles pertaining to Two-Adult Leadership and other requirements that require leadership to be at least 21 years of age.

All Exploring Participants "EP" will continue to count as youth within your youth membership reports.






PROGRAM VS. SURVEY

Where can I find the new Exploring Leader training?

The new Exploring adult leader trainings are accessed through the new training page at <u>www.exploring.org</u>. Users will be redirected to <u>my.scouting.org</u>. Be sure to use Google Chrome internet browser. Expect unpredictable results when you use other browsers. After you login, click on the Exploring image on the right. This will take you to the full Exploring training course catalog.

Will my MyParticipation.org login credentials also work at My.Scouting.org?

Yes! The user ID and password you created for MyParticipation will also work at <u>my.scouting.org</u>. If you have not created a MyParticipation.org account, you will still need to do so because the Youth Protection Training is only available at MyParticipation, and not at My.Scouting.org.

Are these trainings tracked?

Yes! As long as your member/participant ID number are saved in your profile (on both MyParticipation and My.Scouting) your completed trainings will be tracked in the national database.

What is a LMS?

A learning management system (LMS) is a software application for the administration, documentation, tracking, reporting and delivery of training courses. The objective of the BSA Learn Center is to provide our volunteers and employees with the content they need, when they need it, providing a quality Exploring program. The BSA Learn Center delivers training content, tracks progress, and sends completion records to my.scouting.org which is the record for reporting.

What about training for district/council committee members?

While the Service Team Chair/Member positions' learning map is already in place and tracked, the district and council committee member positions' learning maps are not <u>vet</u> in place, thus, they are not tracked. The district and council committee chairs and members will be required to complete a different set of modules within the modules that are already available through the Exploring LMS.


