

Safety Moment Ideas & Tips*

Safety Moment Ideas & Tips

- Ideas for Safety Topics...
 - The possibilities of what to cover in your safety moment are unlimited. Your subject doesn't even need to be about an Exploring activity or an event or the participating organization's workplace. Driving, diet, fitness, home emergency preparedness—all are worthy subjects.
 - If you're feeling overwhelmed, experiencing a safety topic block, or seeking inspiration from others, there are loads of resources online. For example, the National BSA offers excellent safety moment examples at <u>https://www.scouting.org/health-and-safety/safety-moments/</u>

• Keep It Fresh & Fun...

- Safety moments happen often. To make them effective, vary them in terms of topics, presentation format, and style. You can use videos, first-person narratives, demonstrations, or interactive role play, and be sure to throw in some humor when appropriate
- Keep your Explorers engaged to ensure your safety moment ideas make the maximum impact



Safety Moment Ideas & Tips continued

- Make Your Safety Moment Useful & Personal...
 - Your Explorers & participating organization personnel are an excellent source for topic ideas. Seek suggestions and encourage them to share their own health and safety experiences, or share your own
 - Personal Explorer or Advisor stories have a particularly strong impact. They often show vulnerability, and vulnerability is linked improved post safety. They're also a great way to encourage communication and post team building. This is an important part of creating a strong post culture, because safety is a team effort
 - But certainly don't shy away from general safety moment ideas. For guidance, look to the weather or upcoming holidays. Winter brings icy surfaces: bring awareness to preventing slip and falls. Summertime is pool time, so address the hazard of drowning and encourage pool safety. If you're searching for a safety moment of the day, think through the particular risks the participating organization's workplace environment poses every day
 - What is most important when choosing a topic is that it be relevant to your Explorers and their needs, and useful



Safety Moment Ideas & Tips continued

- Anatomy of a Safety Moment...
 - So you've homed in on your topic, and it's one that you feel will be very useful to your post. Now what? You've got about five minutes to communicate the message. A few key elements to consider for a successful presentation include the following:
 - Provide the "why": Begin by letting Explorers know why you chose this topic, why you felt it was relevant to them. If the topic was someone suggestion, say so. Let post know you're listening
 - Make it concise and narrowly focused: You have a couple minutes to present your topic; stay on point and don't try to cover too much
 - Make it conversational: These are not formal safety meetings nor are they a time for you to dictate behavior. Keep the tone friendly and conversational
 - Provide takeaways: Give your post ways to implement the topic you've presented. This makes your safety moment feel useful and applicable in the real world
 - Ask and encourage questions: This is an excellent opportunity for dialog, feedback, and creating community.

Final Approval Authority of Committee: National Learning for Life Executive Board (Delegation of Authority)

Membership and Structure: National Exploring Committee shall consist of only the positions designated above with National Exploring Resource Associate Advisors designated as members-at-large.

Quorum and Voting: National Exploring Committee only makes recommendations to be finalized and approved through the National Learning for Life / Exploring Executive Board.

Recommendations require a majority vote of the Committee members' casting votes with a quorum of three quarters of the lead/advisor position members participating. Voting may be conducted in person or electronically. The staff advisor will ensure that the recommendation is within the committee's charter before submitting.

Agenda & Minutes: Minutes are created and approved only for the National Learning for Life / Exploring Executive Board Meetings.

Exploring Committee Meeting* Dates: On the fourth Monday of each month via Zoom. 5:00 pm EST/4:00 pm CST/3:00 pm MST/2:00 pm PDT. Special meetings and occasional in-person meetings may be called.




National Exploring Subject Matter Experts & Exploring Resource Associate Advisors





Barriers to Abuse Update

- As part of our ongoing commitment to abuse prevention, the Boy Scouts of America, to include Exploring, is updating the adult supervision requirements for overnight activities
- This update enhances the minimum "two deep leadership" requirements by additionally requiring every adult present on overnight activities to be a registered member of the Boy Scouts of America or Exploring
- These adults must submit an adult application and registration fee, undergo a criminal background check, a volunteer screening database check and must complete mandatory Youth Protection training.
- A limited exception for parents and legal guardians of Cub Scout youth attending overnight with their children is planned due to the family centric nature of Cub Scouting
- All Cub Scout Packs, Scouts BSA Troops, Venturing Crews, Sea Scouting Ships, Exploring Posts, council, and district overnight programs will be required to comply with this update by September 1, 2023. We encourage early adoption prior to the effective date
- This updated Barrier to Abuse will be referenced as part of the Guide to Safe Scouting, Exploring's Safety First Guidelines, Youth Protection and Adult Leadership section, Scouting's Barriers to Abuse. Youth Protection and Barriers to Abuse FAQ's will be expanded to include additional FAQ's as they are developed

George Denise completed his Exploring Fast Start training on 1/01/2011 and his most recent position is Service Team Chair for my district since February 2018. He has been involved with every aspect from FOS and volunteer recruitment to membership, product sales, program and unit service. George helped Exploring District achieved significant growth in our FOS campaign and 5% membership growth last year. We are at 61% of our FOS goal for the year, second highest percentage in our council. As we shelter-in-place, he secured a dynamic guest speaker for our Science Night and saved us \$650 in shipping cost in our Make A Mask Challenge. His efforts made it possible for us to donate thousands of pieces of protective medical gear to 7 medical facilities in 2 counties. He supported a 15 year old Scout in the Medical Explorer program whom has wanted to make a difference. What started as a local mask-making challenge turned into a multi-city effort through connections of Scouting friends in Dallas, TX and Orange County, CA to Santa Clara county.

EXPLORING PARTICIPANT POLICY "EP" (18 THROUGH 20 YR OLD EXPLORERS)

Effective August 1, 2020, all applicants 18 through 20 years old must complete and submit an adult application, consent to a criminal background check, and successfully complete Youth Protection training.

However, an 18- through 20-year-old will still be considered an Adult Exploring Participant in the post and will not be considered an adult leader. Therefore, an "EP" will not be allowed to fulfill adult leadership roles pertaining to Two-Adult Leadership and other requirements that require leadership to be at least 21 years of age.

All Exploring Participants "EP" will continue to count as youth within your youth membership reports.







- An email notification and a renewal link will be sent 60 days before membership expires.
- The link provided in the email will direct individuals to a renewal form on My.Scouting
- If registered in multiple positions, select the primary position. Renewing the primary position will automatically renew multiple positions.
- The individual pays with a credit card and submits the renewal.
- The unit will approve the membership renewal.

Auto Renewal Membership Unit Pay

- In Organization Manager, the unit selects the Unit Pay option.
- Unit Key 3s are notified each month about which members are due to renew that month.
- Using the Roster tab, the unit selects which members they are renewing.
- The unit can choose not to renew a member (opt-out). The unit can also change the Scout's Life subscription settings for each person.
- The unit pays with a credit card or establishes a securely stored electronic fund transfer payment (ACH) and submits the renewal.
